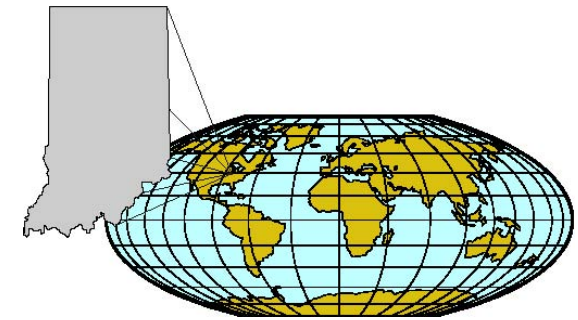

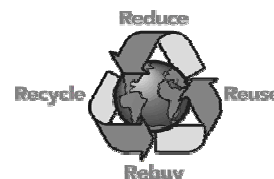
Cancellations and Refunds
