COUNTDOWN TO 2004: Looking for Volunteers to Fill Key Committees for AWMA 2004 Annual Meeting in Indianapolis

The Indiana Chapter will be hosting the AWMA Annual Meeting and Exhibition (ACE) from June 20-24, 2004 at the Indianapolis Convention Center. Sound like a long way off? Well maybe, but it has already been two years since a small group of Chapter members traveled to Pittsburgh along with the Indianapolis Convention and Travel Bureau to make a pitch to the AWMA Board to host the ACE. Detroit and Chicago were also interested in hosting the 2004 ACE but in the end the Board of Directors cast their votes in our favor.

Preliminary planning activities have continued since that time led by Dave Hoffman and Anne Heighway, General Conference Chair and Vice-Chair, pending Board approval. Both attended last year's ACE in Orlando and met with their leadership. Conference calls have been held with the past two General Conference Chairs and copies of all of their planning meeting minutes obtained.

AWMA's Meetings Manager has signed hotel contracts with the Marriott and Westin, which will serve as co-headquarters for the ACE. A contract was also recently finalized with the Hyatt and several others are in negotiation. Indy's Convention

EPA's Bob Wayland and IDEM's Janet McCabe to Discuss MACT Hammer at Spring Technical Meeting

Registration forms and all details will be mailed out mid-March.

The Indiana Chapter will hold its Spring Technical Meeting at the Indianapolis Airport Radison on April 16, 2002. The technical meeting will focus on MACT regulations and the upcoming regulatory "hammer" date of May 15, 2002. The EPA has a mandate to propose NESHAP standards for a variety of source categories, some of which are found in the table below.

Although rules have not been proposed for most of these categories, potentially affected sources may need to take certain actions before May 15, 2002 to remain in compliance with

the provisions of the Clean Air Act.

Speakers at the upcoming technical meeting will be Mr. Bob Wayland, Group Leader of the Combustion Group at the EPA's Office of Air Quality Planning & Standards (OAQPS), and Ms. Janet McCabe, the Assistant Commissioner of the IDEM's Office of Air Quality.

Interpretation of the "MACT hammer" requirements changes on an almost daily basis. Court decisions are also impacting the "hammer" date requirements. Wayland and McCabe will provide an update on agency policies regarding the "hammer" provisions and what individual sources should do to comply.

Notes on Air Board Rulemaking to Amend the Emissions Reporting Rule 326 IAC 2-6 *Jim Hauck, Barnes & Thornburg*

This rulemaking began in 1997, with IDEM's publication of a First Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. No Second Notice was published until February 2001. The rule was preliminarily adopted in April 2001, with the caveat that Air Board members wanted to see more agreement between IDEM and the regulated community before final adoption.

The preliminarily adopted version would:

- Add 58 hazardous air pollutants ("HAPs") to the list of reportable air pollutants.
- Expand applicability of the rule to all Title V and FESOP sources.
- Require reporting of detailed information on stack and emission unit parameters.
- Require reporting emissions by process.
- Set a minimum reporting threshold of 20 lb/yr for all HAPs.

In October, the Environmental Quality Service Council recommended a workgroup approach, and workgroup meetings were then held on January 16 and February 20, 2002.

At the January workgroup meeting, IDEM stated that a primary reason for proposing amendments to rule is that it feels it needs information on HAPs emissions and ambient concentrations to identify problems and target reductions. However, IDEM also announced that it would support the following changes to its proposed rule:

- Drop the FESOP reporting proposal, except for nonattainment and maintenance areas (IDEM indicated that it would seek EPA approval to also drop FESOP applicability in maintenance areas).
- For nonattainment counties, raise the reporting threshold from 10 tpy to 25 tpy, and apply the threshold to VOCs only, and not NOx, as in the current rule.
- Three-year reporting cycle for all reporting sources (except PSD-major sources and VOC sources in non-attainment counties, which would report annually.)
- IDEM has asked EPA to approve a July 1 submittal date for all sources.
- IDEM will allow grouping of similar processes for reporting, as well as grouping of stack information, "subject to finding suitable language."
- Allow use of emission factors and other factors acceptable to IDEM/ EPA.
- IDEM will open discussion on threshold reporting levels for HAPs.

Also during the January meeting, the work group raised the following additional issues:

- Non-regulatory ways to get the data IDEM wants.
- The need to set reasonable minimum reporting thresholds.
- The need for process level data.
- The need for a less burdensome approach.

The February 20 meeting addressed the costs of rule amendments and non-regulatory means of getting data. IDEM circulated a draft cost analysis indicating that it estimated the cost of the preliminarily adopted requirements to be between \$489 and \$871 on average per plant for the first report, and one-tenth of that amount for subsequent reports. The final workgroup meeting is scheduled for March 20.
