Meeting for Indiana Chapter*

The Indiana Chapter of the Air and Waste Management Association conducted its annual business meeting on May 8, 2003, at the offices of Heritage Environmental in Indianapolis. Twenty-six (26) people were in attendance for the business meeting. Sixteen (16) were members of the Chapter. Therefore, a quorum was present under Article VII, Section 4. The Chapter Chair, Valerian Simianu with Secor, Inc. presided.

Gary Lindgren and Bruce Knight of Heritage Environmental provided an overview of Heritage operations and a tour of the Indianapolis facility. Heritage Environmental was given an honorary "sponsor" designation for donating a lunch for the members.

During the meeting, Eugene Paik of Cornerstone Environmental was elected to the position of Director-North; Kristen Belcredi of Keramida Environmental was elected to the position of Director-At-Large.

The members present unanimously ratified changes to the Chapter By-Laws which will be known as the May 8, 2003 amendments. The amendments changed the Chapter's fiscal year to January 1 to December 31. Therefore, a new business meeting will be necessary in the fall, 2003, to conduct elections for officers for the 2004-2005 period.

Moving toward June 2004, there are several milestones along the way that authors, panelists and session chairs need to be aware of:

September 19, 2003	Abstract Deadline
Early November 2003	Planning meeting in Indy to slate the abstracts in sessions
November 14, 2003	Confirmation of acceptance of abstracts
January 23, 2004	Draft Manuscripts are due
April 2, 2004	Final Manuscripts are due

This schedule is designed to allow for current information to be included in the publication of the final manuscripts that are included with the conference proceedings.

There are also opportunities for anyone interested in serving as a Session Chair for the technical sessions. Many of the sessions that were submitted by the LHC were submitted with the commitment that we would find chairs for those sessions. As a Session Chair, you will help recruit authors and panelists and ensure that their manuscripts and presentations are submitted before the deadline. You will also participate as part of the peer review team of those manuscripts. At the conference, you serve as a moderator for the session, introducing the speakers and keeping them on schedule. For those of you who are new to the Association, this is a terrific way to become more involved!!

While the final results of the San Diego Annual Conference and Exhibition are still being tallied, it was clearly a success. Attending this year's conference were over 3,300 environmental professionals from around the world. Although exhibitor space was down 14% there was an offsetting increase in the number of paid attendees. An encouraging note for Indy '04 is that 65% of the square footage available at the Indiana Convention Center has already been booked by next year's exhibitors.

Indy's 2004 Local Host Committee (LHC) members spread throughout the complex array of technical program elements, Board and Council Meetings as well as behind the scenes functions like the room monitors training area and press room. The purpose? Gathering information and taking notes to make Indy '04 even better. Our presence was highly visible at the "Welcome to Indy" booth courtesy of the Indiana Convention and Visitors Association. Staffed with numerous volunteers that were decked out in matching Indy '04 polo shirts funded by the Indiana Chapter, the booth distributed our new Indy lapel pins in addition to a variety of informational travel brochures.
