## *"Air Permitting and Compliance" the Focus of October 7 Fall Technical Meeting*

*By Jim Hauck, Hatchett & Hauck LLP*

The Indiana Chapter of the Air & Waste Management Association will address permitting and compliance strategies for sources subject to air pollution control regulations at its Fall Technical Meeting in Indianapolis on October 7, 2004. Seven speakers from the private and government sectors will address management of compliance data, requirements under the National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants ("NESHAP") that apply to a large number of sources in Indiana, perspectives of IDEM and EPA enforcement personnel, and legal strategies for the annual compliance certification requirement under Title V or synthetic minor permits.

Leading off the agenda will be Dr. Valerian Simianu of M3V, LLC discussing approaches for using technology to organize compliance data in a variety of situations. Eugene Paik of Superior Environmental Corporation will address the extremely detailed and often cumbersome provisions under the NESHAP regulations for startup, shutdown, and malfunction plans and operation and maintenance plans.

# *QEP - Qualified Environmental Professional*

## **QEP Certification- Demonstrated Broad Professional Competence**

The QEP certification is awarded by the Institute of Professional Environmental Practice (IPEP). QEP is an international certification that demonstrates a *broad* understanding of environmental issues. QEP certification demonstrates your marketability, professional competence, and adherence to a code of professional ethics.

### **Two Options to Become Certified:**

1. For senior, experienced environmental professionals, an oral exam, designed to be a 90-minute interview.
2. For others, a two-part written exam. The first part is a general environmental science multiple choice exam. The second part is a specialty exam of the applicant's choice: air, water, waste management, or environmental science management policy.

### **Who is eligible?**

Oral exam requirements are a baccalaureate degree and at least 15 years of subsequent professional environmental work experience acceptable to IPEP; demonstration of at least 10 qualifying years in a position of responsible charge; and at least one of the three required references being supplied by a QEP.

Written exam requirements are a baccalaureate or equivalent degree in physical, earth or natural sciences, engineering, or mathematics and 5 subsequent years of professional environmental work experience, or 8 subsequent years of professional environmental work experience with a baccalaureate degree in a discipline other than those listed above.

The second half of the morning will feature presentations of IDEM and EPA personnel charged with civil and criminal enforcement of Clean Air Act programs. Clean Air Act enforcement cases remain a top priority at the federal and state levels. Annual compliance certification requirements in Title V permits and similar provision in other permits and regulations add new dimensions to the considerations for the regulated community in this area.

One of the newest NESHAP rules addresses industrial/commercial/institutional boilers and process heaters (commonly referred to as the "Boiler MACT") and will apply to many facilities in Indiana. Ann McIver of Citizens Thermal Energy and James Eddinger of U.S. EPA's Emissions Standards Division will address the requirements of this rule and what sources should consider in preparing for compliance.

Finally, Jim Hauck of Hatchett & Hauck LLP will provide an environmental lawyer's perspective on strategic and practical considerations for preparing for and executing the annual compliance certification that is required under Title V and synthetic minor permits.

The Fall Technical Meeting provides an excellent opportunity for environmental professionals who deal with air pollution control regulations to address some of the most important topics currently facing them.
