SB 511 Brings Big Changes to Haz Waste Manifest Program

Indiana's state hazardous waste manifest program was created in 1986. Rules were written to provide instruction on which state manifest to use and how to complete the manifest. Initially, only large quantity generators (LQGs), transporters, and treatment, storage, and disposal facilities (TSD facilities) were required to complete a manifest when shipping hazardous waste off-site. LQGs and TSD facilities were also required to submit a copy of the manifest used (regardless as to which manifest was used) to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) within 5 days of shipping or receiving hazardous waste. In 1992, small quantity generators (SQGs) were added to the rules and were required to complete a manifest and submit a copy to IDEM within 5 days of the shipment.

Indiana's General Assembly passed Senate Bill 511, in March 2000, which affects several hazardous waste manifest requirements. The following are the changes that will take effect January 1, 2001:

DIRECTIONS TO THE EAGLE'S HIDE-A-WAY

From the South Take I-465 North to 56th Street West. ** Proceed past the south entrance to Eagle Creek Park on 56th Street. Cross over the Reservoir on the causeway and turn right (north) on Raceway Road. Raceway Road takes a jog that follows CR 700E for a short distance. Follow Raceway Road north to West 65th Street. Turn right (east) on West 65th Street and follow the signs to the Hide-A-Way.

From the North Take I-65 South to Lafayette Road. Proceed north on Lafayette Road to 56th Street. Turn left (west) on 56th Street. Follow directions above from the "****" above .

There will no longer be an Indiana Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest form.

Hazardous waste generators and facilities will no longer be required to purchase or use an Indiana manifest form to ship hazardous waste.

Generators shipping waste to Indiana treatment, storage, or disposal facilities will be required to use their States' manifest or the federal uniform hazardous waste manifest if their State does not have their own manifest.

Generators and treatment, storage, and disposal facilities will no longer be required to submit copies of their completed manifests to IDEM.

Indiana generators and treatment, storage, and disposal facilities are still required to put EPA waste codes on the manifest form used.

Generators and treatment, storage, and disposal facilities are still required to follow all recordkeeping and reporting requirements.

Please be advised that if you purchase any more manifests during the remaining year of 2000, you are still required to pay the eight (\$8) dollar purchasing fee and refunds will not be given if you have a surplus of Indiana manifests at the end of the year.

You will still be allowed to use any remaining inventory of Indiana manifests for your shipments of hazardous waste.

In addition, Senate Bill 511 has established an annual report which must be submitted to IDEM, on forms provided by IDEM, beginning March 1, 2002 for all SQGs, LQGs, and TSD facilities. The annual report will summarize a company's hazardous waste manifest shipments sent and/or received. SQGs will be required to submit the annual report by March 1st of each year. LQGs and TSD facilities will be required to submit the US EPA Hazardous Waste Report on the years they are due and the IDEM annual report on the other years. The reporting schedule for LQGs and TSD facilities is as follows:

March 1, 2002 US EPA Hazardous Waste Report due
March 1, 2003 IDEM annual manifest report due
March 1, 2004 US EPA Hazardous Waste Report due
March 1, 2005 IDEM annual manifest report due, etc...

Report forms are in the process of being developed and approved. IDEM will be developing means to allow electronic reporting of the manifest annual report. IDEM is looking into several options, such as developing a reporting software package for electronic reporting, allowing flat file submissions, or a Web enabled application to enter and

submit the information to IDEM through the Internet. The distribution of the report forms will be handled differently than the usual distribution method for the US EPA Hazardous Waste Report. The manifest annual report forms will only be distributed to companies the first reporting year. Each company will be required to keep the originals and make copies of the forms as needed over the reporting years. New forms will not be sent out each year, however, the report forms will be available on the Web.

Beginning 2001, IDEM will be doing several half-day workshops to discuss the changes in the current manifesting requirement and the new manifest annual reporting requirements. If time permits, the workshops will be open to any other subjects concerning RCRA and SARA Title III reporting.
